### YEAH...

Our weekly lunches and programs have started back up on Tuesdays and Thursdays at Emanuel UCC. We are so glad to be back into the routine and having informative and fun programs available to us. And let me not forget the good food and wonderful fellowship that goes along with it all!! Where else can you get so much for such little money?? At the monthly Senior Board meeting on the 16th, I kind of painted a grim picture for the group. The reality of it is that it costs the seniors about \$2000-\$3000 per month to exist with the transportation and food programs that we currently have. The only grant we receive is directed toward transportation. It is used solely to help offset the cost of running the bus. This grant does not cover even half of our transportation expenses. However, the Manchester Seniors rely primarily on donations and contributions from individuals. groups, and organizations. That is the only way we can make it! Our seniors pay a small fee each time they use the bus. We still must pay for workmen's insurance. maintenance, government mandated inspections, and wages.

The Seniors of Manchester are very fortunate to have a bus that they can use for medical runs, lunch programs, meal deliveries and activities. I am afraid at this point, unless we find a person or persons to help locate more funds, we are on a downward spiral.

The Manchester Seniors are currently in need of a person who could assist us in searching out available donors to keep the program going. Only a Board member can actually apply for the contribution. Please let me know if you have any knowledge, experience, or interest in working on this. Keep in mind...everyone benefits from the Senior Citizens' programs, young and old alike. We are all going to be there some day!!

Hope to see you at a Tuesday or Thursday lunch. Remember, the meals are open to the public, not just seniors!!

### You Are Cordially Invited to join

the Lucy Wolcott Barnum Chapter, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution, as we dedicate an historic marker and celebrate the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the **Daughters of the American** Revolution on **Sunday, October 11, at 2 p.m.**, at **Croswell House**, 228 North Broad Street in Adrian. House tours will be given from 1 to 2 p.m. Parking is very limited at Croswell House. You may want to park in the city lot near the farmer's market (Toledo Street) or in the lot by the former business known as The Pharm (Front Street).

Daniel Hicks, an early pioneer of Adrian and uncle of Charles Miller Croswell, built the Greek Revival Croswell House in the 1840s. Croswell bought the house from his aunt in 1853, following the death of his uncle. Croswell had an illustrious political career and served as the 17<sup>th</sup> Governor of the State of Michigan from 1877 through 1880. His widow, Elizabeth Musgrave Croswell Merrill, donated the house to the chapter in 1927 as a memorial to Governor Croswell.

Croswell House was placed on the Michigan Register of Historical Sites on February 19, 1958, and on the National Register of Historical Sites on March 16, 1972.

The Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) was founded on October 11, 1890. It is a non-profit, non-political volunteer women's service organization dedicated to historic preservation, patriotism, and education. There are 177,000 members in 3000 chapters throughout the world. Almost 1 million women have joined the DAR since its founding.

We hope you will join us for this festive celebration of a local landmark and of the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the Daughters of the American Revolution.
