
The Christmas Schooner is based on true stories of historic Great Lakes voyages of Christmas tree ships during the late 1800's and early 1900's. It is the story of lumbermen who lived in Manistique on the north shore of Lake Michigan and hauled lumber across Lake Michigan to fast-growing Chicago in the 1880s on a schooner they called the Molly Doone.

In 1881, Capt. Peter Stossel (Aaron Treadway, from Clinton) receives a letter from his cousin Martha (Elise Hardcastle from Clinton) in which she reminisces about Christmases in Germany, the beautiful Tannenbaum, and how lucky Peter and his family are to have so many Christmas trees, whereas in Chicago, where there is a large population of German-Americans, they have very few and they are picked over. The next year, Capt. Stossel decides to take a load of Christmas trees to Chicago--across Lake Michigan in November, braving the deadly winter weather. The whole family will enjoy this heart-warming story about the courage of the men who risked their lives so others could know the joy of Christmas.
