

In 1973 Rev. Joseph Wise Pastor of Emanuel UCC and Gene Nelson Interim Pastor went to the Sr. Club to promote an outreach program for betterment of all seniors. Several organizing meetings were held with churches, business and organizations. Gene left in June and in July Greg Kammin became the Interim Pastor. Ethel Kerr was chosen as chairperson and Greg Co-Chair. Ethel remained as Chair until her death April 1980.

Our seed money came from Emanuel Women, United, M [Methodist] Women, St. Marys and the JCs.

Greg set up crafts and cards with donations for refreshments and a kitty for coffee.

Greg built a ramp to make it wheel chair accessible.

Volunteer drivers were set up to drive people to the doctor, dentist and drug store. Mary Schaible was contact person, followed by Hilda Ernst and now Helen Knickerbocker. Shopping trips were taken on school buses with riders paying for gas and driver. When bus use was withdrawn we carpooled.
