Dial- a-Ride was started by the County. It wasn't very successful in this part of the County. Both Manchester Village and Township contributed to the Dial-A-Ride. Ray Gonyer went to their meeting to ask that it be used locally to pay gas for volunteer drivers. Both agreed. In Feb. 1982 Ray Gonyer and Chief Zsenyuck trying to get us a bus! In April of 82 the State loaned us a van until we could get a bus. The bus arrived in March 1983 and the State didn't want the van back. Seat belts were installed on the bus in 1984.

With the help of Rev. Maurice Sharai we got our incorporation papers in 1978.

Our Bylaws were approved in 1981.

In 1985 the club and council combined—to be known as Manchester Area Sr. Citizen Inc. Under Greg Kammin's leadership we made many trips to Ann Arbor to get a nutrition program, unwilling to wait for all the red tape we met with the Village rest. [restaurant]. Bought a food carrier (which we still have) and started meals in June 1975 to shut-in 3 days a wk at \$2.00. Drivers were LeRoy and Emma Marx, Helene Kemner, and Mary Schaible and L. Uphaus with Ethel Kerr filling in. This was done until the rest closed in March 76.

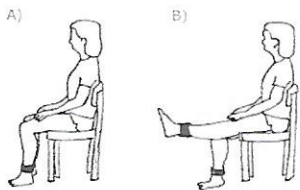
