More meetings in Ann Arbor but decided to hire Ethel Weir for 2 days a week in Mar. 77. Meals were \$1.50. We went to \$2.00 Nov. 79. United Way granted money for those who couldn't afford it.

We have had many donations of garden produce, desserts from individuals, JC Aux[auxiliary], sororities. Many thanks to all.

I remember with much joy taking meals to Mr. W. Lamming. The food always pleased him, he didn't want us to have a routine for delivering as he wanted to anticipate. I used to feel guilty visiting while his meal was getting cold, but soon realized the visit was as important as the food.

Oct 1983 we were granted funds for program director—Jan Nali. We reapplied and received some for 84-85. But could not apply again for 1 yr.

We have had 3 fun nights—2 at the mill and one at Emanuel.

A housing Committee was set up in 82 with Chelsea Hosp. That is on hold.

Our money making projects have been 3 yard sales, booths at farm market, helping on mill runs and our card parties at P.[Pleasant] Lake, also our quilt raffles.
