She was born on Thanksgiving Day, November 28, 1929, in Wayne, Michigan to William and Edna (Waechter) Krueger. She grew up on a farm in Romulus Twp. and was a 4-H club leader. In 1949 she married William Kittendorf, and they lived Taylor, Michigan for thirty years. In 1980 they moved to Manchester.

To further her education, she enrolled in a GED program in 1964. She was a student at Eastern Michigan Univ. where she graduated Summa Cum Laude and the University of Michigan where she earned a Master's Degree and a Doctorate in English Language and Literature in 1975.

Dr. Kittendorf retired from teaching in 1993. She was a Sunday School Teacher in St. Paul UCC in Taylor and a Bible Class Teacher in Emanuel UCC in Manchester. She and Bill were active members of Emanuel United Church of Christ and the Farm Bureau. In addition to her love of reading and writing poetry, Doris loved all aspects of homemaking, gardens and flowers. She wrote her own biography and put Bill's life story into a poem. 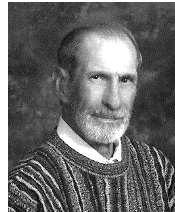

** Update: Paul Whelan has been moved to a different location and is doing well. He has been able to call his family and have short conversations. US Ambassador John Sullivan visited Paul Whelan in a penal colony Mordovia five thousand miles from Michigan, where Paul ought to be - at home, with his family. Paul was in good spirits. It was a relief to see him in person," Sullivan said in a statement. The diplomat argued that the ex-marine had been "unjustly tried and convicted by a Russian court" in a secret trial. "As long as I am here in Russia, as long as I am the U.S. Ambassador to the Russian Federation, I will keep advocating for Paul - for fair treatment, and for his immediate release. Paul would appreciate letters from home and what is going on in your lives (especially with the holiday coming.)
