**** BEWARE OF SCAMS ALERT ****

The following information is from the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Office, Sergeant Gebauer.

WCSD has received numerous daily complaints of identity theft and fraud most of these originating from telephone scams. Our mission includes creating public safety and to that end we urge the community to be aware of telephone and other types of SCAMS.

There have been numerous scams which occur daily but a few most common scams are as follows:

1. IRS Scams {A fictitious IRS Agent calls you and tells you if you don't pay them money they will arrest you and foreclose on your home};
2. Employment Scams {An unknown subject calls enticing you to apply for a job and they offer to pay you simply for applying};
3. Family Emergency Scams {A perpetrator tells you a family member has been injured or has another type of emergency and needs you to send them money ASAP}.
4. Most recently an unknown service calls you and asks "Can you hear me?" When you answer 'Yes' your voice is digitally recorded and saved to be used later to obtain goods and services in your name that you did not authorize

* Manchester had another victim in mid-December that lost \$17,000.

These are just a few of the numerous scams. Community Safety is everyone's responsibility and by spreading the word to simply hang up or disconnect scam telephone calls. DO NOT give any personal information to anyone you do not know, we can make our communities, safer at all ages!"

Hope is on the horizon with a COVID-19 vaccine
The FDA has authorized the emergency use of a vaccine that prevents COVID-19. Scientists around the world agree that the COVID vaccine is our best hope for ending the pandemic.

This week, Saint Joseph Mercy Health System received its first shipment of the FDA-Approved Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine, and began administering on a voluntary basis to health care personnel who provide direct patient care to COVID-19 patients.

With two vaccines on the horizon, chances are you have some questions about the vaccine. We are committed to keeping you and our community informed and educated. That's why we've compiled a list of frequently asked questions to help you better understand how the vaccines were created, some of the safety protocols the CDC and FDA have in place and the current plans for distribution.
