For September the delicious, nutritious meals are available from 11:30am to 12:30 through pick-up and delivery. We are not sure when or if the dine in meals will begin.

The meals are prepared and available at the Emanuel United Church of Christ Fellowship Hall back entrance located at 324 West Main Street.

Meal Prices: Seniors (55 and older) are \$4.00, those under age 55 are \$4.50 and meals delivered are \$5.00. To reserve a meal for <u>take-out or delivery</u> call Pam at 734-385-6308.

PLEASE CALL: by 10 a.m. the day before the meal or earlier. We ask that you call ahead of time to make sure we are preparing enough food. Reserved meals will be taken care of first. If there are meals left, they can be picked up. Menus will be printed in our newsletter, "The Trumpeter.

MASCC is <u>looking for volunteers</u> to be on call to deliver meals if our regular volunteers are unavailable. It takes about an hour and a half to two hours depending on how many meals need to be delivered in the area and the weather conditions. Transportation and a free meal are provided to volunteers.

Ongoing discussions continue, on subject of the Village of Manchester converting to a city.


