

WE HAVE A SPACE OF OUR OWN

For a long time, the Manchester seniors have wished for and dreamed about a place that we could call home. A place where we can socialize, plan events, classes, and activities. That dream has now become a reality, thanks to 5 Healthy Towns. The MASCC Board was granted \$4,000 to rent the "kindergarten room" at 410 City St. the old Ackerson school building. The grant will lease the room from April 1 until September 30, 2023. for a pilot program. Requests for additional funding were sent to local establishments to help buy cleaning supplies, paint, shelving, renovate the bathroom and other items. The response has been overwhelmingly supportive. Requests for donations of specific items will be made public in the next few weeks.

Our goal is to provide space for social gatherings, nutritional and health education, games, movies, needlework, sewing, reading, scrap booking, and bingo, to name a few. Most activities will be free, with a donation box on site. Our success will depend upon community support, not only financially but help planning and organizing activities

The luncheons will remain in the Emanuel Church basement at noon on Tuesday and Thursday. The monthly board meetings will continue to be held in the Senior Room in the lower level of the Village Hall on the 2nd Wednesday at 9:30 a.m. For updates Watch on Facebook and in The Manchester Mirror.

Paul looks forward to receiving mail from "home" and will continue to send a hand-written reply once the mail reaches hmi. ~ Wed. Dec.28, 2022, marked the of the 4th year of imprisonment for Paul Whelan. As negotiations continue, the Whelan family here in the US has observed two Americans returned home through prisoner swaps. Another person who had been "detained" in Russia for the last nine months was released via Poland on Thursday of last week. Yet Paul continues to mark his days (a total of 1,480 as of Monday, January 16) away from his family.

Manchester residents have started a yellow ribbon campaign to support Paul and his family here in Manchester. To show support hang a yellow ribbon or bow in your yard, on the door, or "around the ole oak tree" — .
