## BUS Business ~ OUR BUS IS BACK ON THE ROAD

We have signed into an agreement with the WAVE to help make our transportation more affordable and available. However, to keep the bus, we must have more riders to show MDOT and other sources, that we have a need for transportation for our seniors and disabled individuals.

This means we must have riders to qualify for grants to help cover gas, driver wages and maintenance expenses.

For the time being, when the bus is operated by MASCC (Tue's and Thu's), we are asking riders for donations. Our goal is to find funding to allow us to provide free rides in the future.

Your support is needed to keep the bus available for round trip rides to the Tuesday & Thursday dine-In luncheons, for activities at the Senior Center and special outings.
