Creating a New

Senior/Community Center in Manchester

The Manchester Area Seniors Citizens (MASC) have never had a place to call home.

The City of Manchester is partnering with MASC and has committed to a 1200 square foot area, rent free, for the seniors to renovate for a permanent community center. The space is a part of the Manchester City Hall (formerly the Ford Building), at 912 City Rd.

The Center will serve as a safe place for seniors to have meals and engage in educational and social activities. It will also be available for intergenerational activities and for use for other community activities.

This campaign will allow MASC to secure the final portion of funding needed to complete the transformation of the space into a fully functional community and gathering space and center for our seniors.

The Project Details will be available at the senior luncheons, euchre night, posted on our social media and Facebook pages. You can also request the information via the Trumpeter email address or by mail.



In case you haven't heard, we went LIVE on Wed. morning, July 3rd with Patronicity to have a funder raiser to match our We have logged into our on-line patronicity.com/manchester with over \$25,000 and another \$18,000 promised. This campaign will allow us to complete the final features within the space

Pat Vailliencourt (the Center Director) has continued to search for grants to help us meet our fund matching goal. There has also been lots of interest and people asking how to donate.
