Free Tax Help Returns to CRC Get Your Taxes Done Free

The Manchester Community Resource Center (CRC) is once again offering free tax preparation help!! starting February 17th.

If your **household earned less than \$69,000 in 2025**, you may qualify for free tax help through the VITA program. When you call to make your appointment, we'll go over a few other details to make sure this program is right for you.

It's easy! You bring your tax documents, Social Security Card, and ID to CRC. We'll help you fill out an intake form and upload everything to Accounting Aid Society. Their IRS-trained volunteers will prepare both your federal and state tax returns for free.

When your return is ready, we'll call you to come back to CRC and sign it. Then the return is filed electronically with the IRS.

You never have to leave Manchester to get your taxes done professionally – for free!
